NDTA (National Dog Training Assembly)

This is the dog obedience show of the year!

It is the nationals not only for obedience but also agility and trials.

Every year, the NDTA is held over labour weekend, (22-24 October), in Taupo.

At the NDTA, an inter-zone competition is run between the five Zones within New Zealand. (We are in Zone 3.) Each Zone puts forward five dogs and their handlers, one from each of the recognised championship tests, (Special Beginners, Novice, Test A, Test B and Test C). These dogs will represent our Zone at the NDTA in October and compete against the other Zones at their designated level. Eg: The dog and handler representing us at the Special Beginner level will compete against the other four dogs from the other Zones who are also at the Special Beginner level.

Each year prior to the NDTA our Zone runs Team Trials to determine who will be chosen to represent the Zone at each of the determined levels.

The Obedience team trials this year are being held on 6, 7, 13 and 14 of August. Anyone wishing to try out for the Team Trials please contact the committee ASAP. Entry form for the NDTA is attached for those that are interested, but the entry form for the Team Trials is still in the process of being approved.

Fundraising

Fundraising to help cover travel and accommodation costs, for those that compete at the NDTA, is also currently being organised.

Reminder...

Don't forget that snoop should be registered before *July 31st* (depending on what area you are in). Our club prefers all dogs to be registered before they can attend a class, but this may not be applicable if you have a puppy, depending on it's age.

Some council's have 'Special Owner' or 'Responsible Owner' discounts. Have a chat to your local council office and see if you fall into this category.

It also pays to keep up to date with the dog control policies. Apparently Porirua City Council is due to change some of it's bi-laws, to coincide with the Australian policies (no idea why!), so make sure you are on top of what is required when exercising, walking or just owning a dog, otherwise it could cost you up to \$3000.00 or even your dog!



Summer Time Cool Down (Recipe)
